

Obituary - Tony Lum

Mr. Tony Lum, who died on the 11th March 2007

Tony, a former deputy head teacher at Ryburn Valley High School, Sowerby, was a long standing member of the Halifax Philatelic Society. He had been President three times, 1982/83, 1993/94 and 2003/04 and a member of the committee for 9 years. His collecting interests were generally thematic with emphasis on the Weather, German Propaganda and the American Wild West, although he did have a very comprehensive collection of Greenland. His weather interest was due to his work as a Weatherman in the Royal Air Force, being stationed in Germany, Wiltshire and Lincolnshire before becoming a teacher.

He won the Thematic Class at the society's competitions on nine occasions, seven consecutively. He was also the society's representative at the YPA for 8 years from 1998 to 2006.

Tony enjoyed his stamps and gave many displays, usually as a member of a team on a society visit. He will be sadly missed by the members of the Halifax Society and fellow collectors in other societies.

Free Table at the YPA Stamp Fair and Convention



Forty Five Years Showing Bits of Coloured Paper

I'm not sure when I gave my first display; around about 1962 I think. It can be a daunting experience giving a display to an audience. Several things can go wrong.

I was invited to give a display to the London University Stamp Club some years ago. Unfortunately it was the week before finals. I was greeted on arrival by a very apologetic President of the Club.

“Sorry,” he said, “We might not have many members attending tonight.” He conducted me to the meeting room. There was one member there. It transpired he was the Secretary who had been delegated to find out if I had any expenses. When I said I had no expenses as I had a season ticket back to my destination he excused himself saying he had twelve hours of revision to cram into the next four hours.



The President and I retired to the bar and I showed him my stamps over a pint of beer. We spent the next two hours in an alcoholic haze. I claim to be one of the few speakers who has given a display to a stamp club with an audience of one.



Then there was the team visit to a stamp club at an American Air Force Base. They were very hospitable, and that was my introduction to Kentucky whisky. This concoction was about 110% proof. Fortunately our driver was teetotal as I'm not sure how I would have found my way home that night.

I used to belong to the Ministry of Defence Philatelic Society (I think I'm still a life member if the Society still exists). We used to meet in the basement of the Admiralty Building in Whitehall, London in the evening. The Ministry of Defence Wine Tasting Club used to meet in the room next door. We always knew when our meetings coincided. There would be a low murmur of voices from the next room at first. Slowly the voices became louder, interspersed with much laughter and clinking of glasses, until the sound from the next room rose in volume to compete with New Years' celebrations in Trafalgar Square. Our speakers often had to shout to be heard.



I hope I'm not giving the impression that my philatelic outings have all been drunken orgies. I once gave a display to the Ladies' Circle of the local church where I was treated to tea and biscuits, and visit from the vicar to bless the occasion. Most visits to societies have been sober and pleasurable experiences.

I really wanted to share with you my 'Rules for Speakers'. Over the years I have tried to conform to these Rules, though perhaps not always without difficulty. I commend these to all speakers and hope they will be a useful guide to giving displays for both the seasoned speaker and the novice:

- Rule 1.** Know your subject and don't bore your audience;
- Rule 2.** Speak clearly, and speak to your audience not to your sheets;
- Rule 3.** Don't tell your audience what is written on your sheets.

I wish all speakers many happy evenings of displaying – but be prepared for the unexpected. And if there are any collectors out there thinking of jumping into the uncertain waters of displaying – don't hesitate, send your details to the Editor and sit back and wait for the invitations to roll in. There is nothing as enjoyable as sharing our collection with other philatelists.



Dan Dare – Pilot of the Future By Chris Phillips



Dan Dare was the leading story in *Eagle* in the 1950/60's. In the fictional story he would be 40 years old in 2007. I have produced 4 sets of 9 "stamps" to celebrate his 40th birthday. These are printed on gummed glossy paper with "printed" perforations.

The sheets of 9 sell for £1.50 each or £5 for a set of 4. They are also available as a complete single sheet (A4) size on the same paper for £5.

As with the 50th anniversary mini sheets produced in 2000, I will be giving a profit donation to the *Eagle Society*. (Keith Howard, Subscription Secretary, 25a Station Road, Harrow, Middlesex, HA1 21E).

I have also produced 5 More Edward 8th miniature sheets - four different ones for the full Coronation Set (totaling 19) for May 1937, and a single one for the Wedding Set of (totaling 4) in June 1937.



The Coronation Set is produced from photographs of in my personal collection of Edward 8th souvenirs produced for the Coronation. The Wedding Set were produced using black and white photographs of the wedding that actually took place in France. Each miniature sheet costs £1.50, or ALL 5 for £6. There is also a A5 size sheet which has one of each of the 19 Coronation stamps on that is on sale for £5.

The profits for these will be going towards the fund raising to enable the *Scarborough Philatelic Society* to pay expenses of important speakers like Richard West, who is appearing on Tuesday 5th June 2007.

I hope to get a few "FDC" serviced as usual, (contact me for prices). All the latest "stamps" are printed on glossy paper with PVA gum, and printed "perforations".



On April 1st a friend in Australia made an announcement that the Machin stamp had had the head reversed so that it was facing right instead of left. Of course, that got me thinking. The Royal Mail have "reinvented" the Machin so many times for different things (airmail, gold, double heads, etc., etc.) that I thought why not one so that our Southern Hemisphere compatriots see our Queen the right way up!!

At the Tuesday 3rd April meeting all the members of the Scarborough PS got a free sheet of 9 of this item, included in the monthly newsletter.

I've had some printed on self adhesive paper, and a few on glossy gummed paper, both kinds in ink jet. They are selling on EBAY, starting price 49p for the single, and £2.49 as a sheet of 9 on self adhesive paper.

It will be appearing in *Stamp Magazine* soon, so watch out for it!

Two Attractive Designs from *Down Under*

In regard to stamp design, everyone has personal favourites. I have a stock book containing stamps from countries that I do not collect, but which are, quite simply, a pleasure to see. Pride of place goes to the stamp illustrated left, the 9d. value from the New Zealand "Peace" set of 1946. The design of the stamp is based on

the view of the Southern Alps from a church on the west coast of New Zealand's South Island. Behind the altar is a window, through which the Waiho Gorge can be seen, and (immediately behind the central cross) a part of the Franz Josef glacier. Since 1946 the ice forming the lower part of the glacier has melted, perhaps as a result of global warming, and the glacier can no longer be seen from the church. The trees in the foreground are also much bigger, but a fine view of the mountains can still be seen through the altar window. The church is often visited by tourists, and a small display inside the church explains the stamp issue.

Another nicely designed stamp is illustrated, right, this being the 1997 issue to commemorate the centenary of the "pigeon-gram" services. Pigeons were used to operate two commercial services between the mainland of New Zealand's North Island and Great Barrier Island. The birds provided a very important link until 1908, when the first telegraph line to the island was laid.



As they say, "beauty is in the eye of the beholder" and personal preferences dictate what might or might not be a good stamp design. In regard to my own preference for what are, I suppose, the more "traditional" designs, these are two very good examples of the kind of art in miniature that is stamp design.

Rather I hope to create an archive for future members. furthermore this archive doesn't have to be a burden to the YPA, it could be lodged with a city archive central to the Yorkshire area, and I will bring this up at one of the future committee meetings.
